FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF TRANSPORTATION, DAURA: A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

he idea of establishing the Federal University of Transportation, Daura, Katsina State, the first of its kind in Nigeria, and probably Africa as a whole, thus transforming Nigeria into a knowledge hub for transportation industry in Africa, was conceived during the Contract negotiation of the Lagos to Kano Railway Modernization Project on 15th May 2018, between the Federal Ministry of Transportation and Messrs China Civil Engineering Construction Company (CCECC Nigeria Ltd) with a sole purpose of technology transfer in the area of transportation.

The building of the University is aimed at properly safeguarding and sustaining the huge investment of the Federal Government of Nigeria in the transportation sector, while addressing the need for a transport-focused education, training, and researchbased institution to compliment the dearth of human capacity in the transportation sector with a deepened focus on the Nation's rejuvenated railway system. For the University project, CCECC Nigeria Limited agreed to contribute an amount not exceeding Fifty Million United States Dollars (US\$50,000,000.00) as an obligation from the profits to be made from the Lagos to Kano Railway Modernization Project for development of the University. However, the contribution will span through the period of the construction of the Lagos to Kano Railway Project.

In order to ensure good work, the Federal Ministry of Transportation, approached Technics, Engineering, Architecture, Marketing (TEAM Nigeria Ltd), the Consultant Company for the Railway Project, to provide pro-bono consultancy services to the Ministry, which it accepted, in the light of the longstanding relationship with the Ministry.

The ground-breaking ceremony for construction of the University took place on Monday 2nd December, 2019 and was performed by the former President and

Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, Federal Republic of Nigeria, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR.

The contribution of the CCECC Nigeria Limited for the University Project was designed to provide for the following facilities in two separate phases:

- i. Canteen: 1 block
- ii. Students' dormitories: 4 blocks
- iii. Faculty staff's dormitories: 2 blocks
- iv. Teaching buildings: 2 blocks
- v. Laboratory buildings: 4 blocks
- vi. Multi-function classrooms: 2 blocks
- vii. Generator and sub-station house: 2 blocks
- viii. Water pumping building: 1 block
- ix. Campus Gate (inclusive of security posts): 1
- x. Library: 1 block
- xi. Logistics building: 1 block
- xii. External works: sports ground, landscaping, etc.: 1
- xiii. Internal roads: 1
- xiv. Fence:1

In addition to the provision of the facilities above, the agreement also included the maintenance of the facilities for five years. It is worth noting that the above-mentioned facilities are not sufficient for a standard University. It will therefore be the obligation of the Federal Government of Nigeria to continue with the provision of the needed infrastructure for smooth operation of the University.

The bill establishing the University, titled "Federal University of Transportation Daura (Establishment) Bill, 2022" was passed into law by the Ninth Senate on 6th April, 2022 and concurred by the Ninth House of Representatives on 22nd November, 2022. The passed Bill was certified by the Clerk to the National Assembly on 1st March, 2023 and subsequently assented into Law on 30th March, 2023 by the former President and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, Federal Republic of Nigeria, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR. The Act has since been enrolled into the records of the Supreme Court of Nigeria and finally gazette.

To ensure smooth take-off of the University, the then Honourable Minister, Federal Ministry of Transportation, Hon. Mu'azu Sambo Jaji approved the constitution of a powerful inter-ministerial committee named "Interim Management Committee (IMC)", which was subsequently inaugurated on the 19th of April, 2023 by the then Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Transportation, Dr. (Mrs.) Magdalene Ajani. The committee was charged with responsibility of commencing academic activities by the University





from September, 2023. The IMC constituted of the following members:

NUC APPROVES 14 TAKE-OFF PROGRAMMES FOR FUTD

he National Universities Commission (NUC) has approved a total of fourteen (14) take-off programmes for the Federal University of Transportation, Daura following its resource verification visit to the University.

The approval was conveyed in a letter addressed to the Vice-Chancellor of the University dated 18th October, 2023 and signed by the Commission's Ag. Director, Academic Planning, Abubakar M. Girei.

"The Ag. Executive Secretary has considered and approved the establishment of full-time mode of the programmes to be run in the Main Campus of the University with effect from 2023/2024 session", the letter stated. The programmes approved for the University were: B.Eng. Civil Engineering, B.Eng. Electrical and Electronics Engineering, B.Eng. Mechanical Engineering, B.Eng. Mechatronics Engineering, B.Eng. Railway Engineering, B.Eng. Highway Engineering, B.Sc. Aviation Management, and B.Sc. Transport Management.

Others were B.Sc. Logistics and Supply Chain Management, B.Sc. Maritime Safety and Environmental Administration, BSc. Railway Transport Management, B.Sc. Sea Port and Dry Port Management, B.Sc. Inland Waterways Safety and Environmental Administration and B.Sc. Maritime Economics.

The letter further stated that "the approval does not cover the part-time mode of delivery of the programmes. The programmes shall bear only the approved title and nomenclature and any change will require the approval of the Commission".

FUTD News Bulletin recalls that the Commission had on 12th October, 2023 carried out resource verification on the University with a view to assessing human and material resources available for its take-off.

TETFUND ORGANIZES TWO-DAY WORKSHOP FOR BENEFICIARY INSTITUTIONS

he Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) has held a two-day workshop for Desk Officers drawn from the 7 northwest geo-political zones.

The event with a theme *"Improving TETFund Intervention Programmes and Processes in Tertiary Institutions"* took place at Meenat Hall in Kano from Tuesday 29th to Wednesday 30th August, 2023.

The series was designed for Desk Officers from the 7 states of the zone in order to fully equip them with knowledge about TETFund guidelines and mandate.

The Federal University of Transportation Daura was adequately represented at the workshop by the Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni.

The workshop was also to further bridge the gap that existed between the Fund and beneficiary institutions, regarding procedures and processes with regards to all intervention lines.

In a welcome address, the Executive Secretary of the Fund, Sonny S.T. Echono expressed worries that most Desk Officers were ignorant of Public Procurement Act, which led them to committing mistakes while making their submissions.

Mr. Sonny further disclosed that the Bureau for Public Procurement had agreed to partner with the Fund to ensure due process and seamless project implementation across institutions.

He said, "We partnered with the Bureau for Public Procurement in conducting this workshop, and this has further enhanced the transparency and accountability of our operations".

The TETFund boss stressed that "As desk officers of the various intervention lines, you carry out a very significant role in the conception, reconciliation, and implementation of the Fund's programmes and processes."

Mr. Sonny explained that "it is obvious that the Fund has taken deliberate actions that are aimed at solving persistent problems and making our process more efficient." he newly appointed Minister of Transportation, Sen. Sa'idu Ahmed Alkali has on Friday, 15th September, 2023 paid a facility visit to Federal University of Transportation, Daura, Katsina State, saying that academic activities will commence in October, 2023.

He disclosed this while addressing journalists when he led his ministry's delegation on an inspection tour to the school's permanent site.

The Minister stated that he was at the University for the inspection in order to see for himself, the level of readiness for the University to commence academic activities.

He stated that what he has seen had proven to him that the University was ready enough as he was earlier informed by the Vice-Chancellor of the institution. He observed that there was need for the contracting company to demarcate the female hostel considering the fact that it was built very close to the male hostel.

"With that done, by October, we will be able to admit our first set of students", he said.

The Honorable Minister said, "I hereby commend the China Civil Engineering Construction Company (CCECC) for building this University as part of its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). I want to challenge other companies to emulate them by building either a school, hospital or something that can benefit Nigerians.

He then appealed to the company to assist the University with a take-off grant to enable it to actualize the October deadline as planned. On his part, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni thanked the Minister for finding time to visit the young University despite his busy schedules.

"To God be the glory, the Minister had gone round and inspected each and every building in company with the contracting and consulting companies.

"The Minister has also expressed his satisfaction with what he had seen and is also in support of the University's plan to commence academic activities, this coming October.

"With the Minister on board, I am sure the University is going to witness rapid development as he has shown commitment from the very day he was announced the Minister of Transportation, Federal Republic of Nigeria", the VC assured.

He said that the University had been provided with modern facilities to aid learning, including hostel for male and female students.

FUTD News Bulletin reports that Sen. Sa'idu Ahmed Alkali was born on February, 12, 1969 in Dukku District of the defunct Northeast State to the late Khadi Ahmed Sa'idu.

He obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree in Economics from the University of Maiduguri, and worked with the Dukku Local Government Council, and later joined the Independent Electoral Commission (INEC).

After former Governor Muhammad Danjuma Goje won the 2003 gubernatorial election, Alkali was appointed the Executive Secretary of the Gombe State Muslim Pilgrims Welfare Board.

1n 2007, Senator Alkali was appointed Commissioner of Information during Goje's second tenure.

He was elected as Senator for the Gombe North Senatorial District in August, 2010 by elections, after the death of the incumbent, Senator Kawu Peto Dukku.

He emerged as the consensus candidate for the People's Democratic Party (PDP), primarily because he was an indigene of Dukku Local Government Area, late Kawu Dukku's LGA and he was reelected in the 2011 general election.

He defected to the All Progressives Congress (APC) in 2017, where he contested and defeated the then incumbent Governor Ibrahim Hassan Dankwambo in the 2019 general elections.

He served in the 6th, 7th and 9th Assembly, chairing various senate standing committees.

Senator Alkali holds the traditional title of Sarkin Gabas Dukku and he is a close associate of Governor Muhammadu Inuwa Yahya and intimate friend to the Vice President, Kashim Shettima.

"Strategic innovation, developing a growth mindset and a laser-like focus on risk management will also be dimensioned in addition to examining various institutional successes benchmark and compare reallife experiences of resource persons and participants", the invitation detailed.

Some of the key learning outcomes include: "Grasp key tenets on the fundamentals of institutional wellness; develop a mindset and a skill set for embracing uncertainty – including the duality and paradox that accompany organizational transformation.

"Gain real-time, actionable insights on organizations that are innovative and are thriving amid uncertainty; Build strategies for managing change in turbulent times; identify and leverage creative opportunities amid disruptions.

"Identify immediate growth opportunities through leveraging Financial Technologies, Digital Assets and Al Driven Big Data Analytics (ai-DBA).

Others were "Identify creative financial and funding models for Institutional Development and Harness humans and technology to drive creative transformation.

The 3-day workshop was delivered using the KASAC Framework which is a five-dimensional executive education and evaluation model developed by the International Institute of Management.

The Framework advocates a strong stand on the basis that "For a CEO to succeed in today's complex business environment, s/he should demonstrate mastery in the five areas of: Knowledge, Analysis, Synthesis, Application and Communication.

FUTD News Bulletin reports that globally respected resource persons some of whom are Scholars-Practitioners that have led teams that have translated long-term intent systematically and broadly across various organizations to make consistent, compounding, short-term progress facilitated the workshop.

It further reports that, at the end of the workshop, participants were conferred with a joint certificate from the University of Mauritius and the Committee of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities.

RUSSIA – AFRICA SIGNS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF TECHNICAL UNIVERSITIES

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between Russia and African countries on the establishment of the Public Professional Association of Technical Universities of Africa and Russia titled "Subsoil of Africa" (Subsoil of Africa" Consortium of Universities).

The signing of the MoU took place during an International Congress titled "Africa Seeks Solution" held at the Conference Hall of Catherine II Saint Petersburg Mining University, Russia.

The event took place between Monday 11th and Thursday 14th December, 2023 and was attended by more than 150 different organizations from 42 countries.

The congress was part of the efforts to implement some of the

major agreements reached at the Russia – Africa Summit held in July this year.

FUTD News Bulletin reports that the Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Transportation, Daura Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni was among the Vice-Chancellors drawn from specialized African Universities to attend the congress.

Delivering his keynote address at the Congress, the Rector of the St. Petersburg Mining University, Russia, who is also the Chairman of the Governing Board of the UNESCO Centre, Prof. Vladimir Litvinenko stated that "Education in the state languages, ensuring the formation of new knowledge, transforming it, and educating in the interests of society, is the foundation of the sovereignty of any state". He went further to say that sovereignty "Is political and legal property of the state, which is expressed in the autonomy, supremacy and independence of state power within the country and in the international arena, should be number one in the UN Sustainable Development Goals".

On his own part, Prof. Omojo Omoji, President of the Subsoil Africa Consortium of Universities highlighted the congress's objective to improve production in mining and processing industries across the continent.

"This is a very important event which has brought together mining experts in geology, metallurgy, geophysics, and other key specialist areas to firstly officially launch the consortium and more broadly to explore ways to enhance the

training of our mining engineers as well as enhance mining and processing efficiencies", he said.

He further emphasized that the congress was also aimed at facilitating the sharing of experience and opportunities for the training of mining engineers and related fields to enhance mining development and efficiency in resource supply chain and value addition.

"Mining remains a cornerstone of the African economy, contributing significantly to revenue and GDP.

"However, the continent continues to face a shortage of specialists capable of mining and processing minerals. The lack of mining engineers and equipment for processing and value addition has resulted in Africa losing billions in potential revenue", He said.

He further expressed hope that the congress would strengthen the Russia – Africa relationship in terms of capacity building for mining engineers and related fields in Africa, ultimately fostering economic development.

FUTD News Bulletin reports that during the Congress there were 3 different panel discussions in which the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni fully participated.

The first panel discussion was held on Tuesday, 12th December, 2023 with a title "Russia and Africa in a Multipolar World – Challenges and Solutions" with V. Litvinenko as a Moderator.

The second panel discussion was held on the same day and it was titled "Education as an essential foundation of national sovereignty" while the last panel discussion was held on Wednesday, 13th December, 2023 with a title "Advanced competencies for the mineral resources sector – assessment methods and prospects for unification". Also on the same day, there had been a signing of the final documents of the Congress which included Declaration of the Congress participants; Agreement (contract) on the establishment of the Consortium "Subsoil of Africa", and Charter and Roadmap of the Consortium "Subsoil of Africa".

During the last day of the Congress, there had been two other presentations, titled "Advanced technologies in oil and g as industry – Russian experience" and "The importance of hydrocarbons in the energy transition".

FUTD News Bulletin further reports that, at the end of the Congress, a Consortium of Specialized Universities was established for the purpose of developing the African Mineral Resources, their associated logistics management and supply chain for the larger benefit of the region with the support of relevant Specialized Universities in the Republic of Russia.

Maiyaki said that the National Universities Commission was committed in bridging the gap for needed capacity to build a better Nigeria by licensing both public and private Universities that meet the requirements laid down by the Commission.

He assured the Vice-Chancellor that the NUC would peruse the documents submitted and provide the Interim Management Committee with all the necessary support in realizing the dream of commencing academic activities this year.

He added that the NUC would partner with the Ministry of Transportation to make sure that the University was nurtured and supported to become a centre of excellence in the transport industry.

He finally congratulated the Vice-Chancellor and the Interim Management Committee for putting in their best and seeing to the readiness of the University to take-off academic activities soonest.

On his own part, the Deputy Executive Secretary, Academic (DES Academic) of the Commission, Dr. Noel Biodun Saliu also congratulated the Vice-Chancellor for his giant stride within the short period of assuming office and reiterated the willingness of the Commission to support him in all ways possible.

He added that the transportation industry had occupied a wide gamut comprising of air, land, and water, and according to him there was urgent need to build a high-powered capacity for effective management of such areas.

he Federal University of Transportation Daura under its Interim Management Committee (IMC) has made a move to partner with the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC) in the area of research and development, others.

This was made known by the Vice-Chancellor and Chairman, Interim Management Committee of the University, Prof Umar Adam Katsayal, mni, when he led the IMC on a courtesy visit to the NCC in Abuja.

The Vice-Chancellor who gave detail on how the University came to existence, stated that the University's Establishment Bill, 2022 had already been assented into law by His Excellency, former President Muhammadu Buhari.

"The Act has been enrolled into the records of the Supreme Court of Nigeria and subsequently gazette. It provides the legislative framework for the establishment of the FUTD to explore in-depth and continuous cutting edge research in transportation engineering, logistics and other courses of interest that will support postmodern transportation industry and to offer diverse courses in its core areas of interest, leading to the award of first degrees, post-graduate degrees, diplomas and other professional certificates", he explained.

Elaborating further, Prof. Katsayal said that "there is a link between communications and transportation systems for both economies, and the link is especially important now as investment in broadband and transportation networks increases across the globe.

"The incidence of COVID-19 pandemic has exposed a stark digital divide in both rural and urban areas between the residents with access to reliable broadband technology and those without it.

"This is because those without

adequate or affordable broadband now, have less-and sometimes noaccess to education, employment, commerce and healthcare services.

"The Information and Communication Technology (ICT) on the other hand, has continued to improve transportation safety and efficiency through intelligence transportation system (ITS) technologies, including the highway advisory radio, the 511 traveler information systems (a US and some other countries system that provides real-time information to travelers about traffic conditions, incidents, and other events that may affect travel).

"Examples of these applications include mobility as a service, realtime transit and traffic information, bicycle and scooter sharing, and real-time navigation system aids", he further detailed.

He further stated that transportation activities, such as advanced and effective traffic

control, rapid incident response, and maintenance, require extensive communication.

He said that the education system in Nigeria must therefore, prepare current and future workforces on how to plan, design, build, maintain, secure, and utilize the powerful communication technologies.

He further pleaded with the NCC to invest heavily in the University by participating actively in Research and Development (R&D) in the area of transportation communications.

Other areas according to the Vicechancellor were areas including preparation of the University's academic brief on programmes in transportation communication, and lecture delivery of the programmes, among others.

He thanked the NCC for granting his team the opportunity to pay the visit and for listening to the demands of the University.

In addition to what the Vice-Chancellor said, Engineer,.... from the Federal Ministry of Transportation spoke more on the relationship that existed between the Ministry and the NCC.

He said that the relationship between the two had been very cordial to the extent that immediately the construction of the University commenced, the NCC requested for a site to construct the Muhammadu Buhari Digital Park which the Ministry reluctantly provided.

He lamented that since from the time the land was allocated to the NCC, there was no communication to the Ministry regarding the progress of work.

Speaking on behalf of the Executive Vice Chairman of the NCC, the Director Research and Development of the Commission, Isma'il Adedigba welcomed the Vice-Chancellor and his team to the Commission and commended them for their commitments in discharging their responsibilities.

He appreciated the team for recognizing the NCC as one of the major stakeholders in education and its development, especially the University of Transportation, Daura.

"The NCC of course has many ways through which it can assist the University in the area of research as we have academic research whereby we support Universities in carrying out researches.

"We also have telecom research based grant whereby we advertize to everyone that has interest to write on the topics advertized to make entries which will pass through various forms of evaluations and then shortlist the successful candidates.

"We also have a package where we look at some challenges and problems. We advertize and invite entries from interested persons to develop digital solutions to those challenges in form of competition and at the end grant is provided for the winners to develop those solutions, among others", he said.

He then requested the IMC to put everything in writing, stating clearly the University's needs, assuring that the NCC would support the University in all ways possible.



According to the letter, the appointment is for a period of fiveyears in line with the University's Establishment Act, 2022, Part 1 Section 3(6).

To hit the ground running, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal assumed duty on 8th May, 2023 and paid a facility visit to the newly established University on Monday, 15th May, 2023 in order to see for himself, the level of preparedness of the University to commence academic activities.

As an experienced academic and administrator who had seen it all through his career with the Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni took with him some experienced University dons to advise him on how best he could run the University as it takes off.

To further strengthen the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Katsayal who was the only appointee in the University working tirelessly



without any Principal Officer because they were yet to be appointed, the Federal Ministry of Transportation on Wednesday, 19th April, 2023 inaugurated an Interim Management Committee for the University.

The inauguration ceremony was held at the Honorable Minister's Conference Room, Federal Ministry of Transportation, Abuja.

Members of the Committee were drawn from Federal Ministry of Transportation, Federal Ministry of Education, and National Universities Commission (NUC) and, while the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni was appointed the Chairman of the Committee.

Members from Federal Ministry of Transportation are Odii N. Berry; Dr. (Mrs.) Mercy Ilori O.; Bernard U. Alaeto; Catherine N. Zosi; Edith O. Osuji-Obi while those from Federal Ministry of Education and National Universities Commission are Mrs. R.G. Ilyasu and Prof. Hafiz Abubakar, respectively. Moreover, the Secretariat has Engr. Aso Vincent C. and Jafar Lawal.

Giving importance to digitization, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni is planning to engage the services of experts that could digitize the University from inception in order to make sure that no record in the University is missing in the future.

Today, we live in a digital age, where many advancements in technology have transformed the way we work. This advancement is seen in how we manage and treat paper-based documents and its progress to being digitized. The non-digitization of paper documents poses significant risks to organizations and businesses.

The purpose of digitization is to make information more easily accessible, storable, maintainable, and shareable through the use of digital technology. it is also to turn something that is "paper based" or analogue into digital format, code, or data that can be read and processed by a computer. It makes it easier to share data and recognize patterns in large amounts of information.

Digitization is the process of converting information from physical format to a digital format

using advanced techniques and technologies such as scanners and OCR tools.

According to Oxford Dictionary, Digitization "is the conversion of text, pictures, or sound into a digital form that can be processed by a computer".

Digitization is known to be the first step that each organization takes to begin its journey towards digital transformation as manual extraction of information from paper documents has proven to be more expensive, inefficient, and prone to mistake.

The advantages of digitization are among others faster access to information; fast file retrieval; increased security; better file and data recovery; and file longevity.

To drive home his agenda for the digitization of Federal University of Transportation, Daura, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni had on Thursday, 17th August, 2023 held a virtual meeting with Global Channel & Partnership DigitalED and the meeting was titled DigitalEds Transformation for F e d e r a I University of Transportation, Daura.

The meeting focused on topics of interest to the University where a system that would enable the University to look through every documented information of students from their entry to exit; a Digital Library that allows students and faculties access to e-books and other academic resources; the kind of Technical Infrastructure required for the University would be developed.

Others were the type of partnership support that would enable access to technical support; a system that allows a view to what is happening on campus in real time; and a learning platform where students can access courses virtually from all over the world and in turn increase revenue.

After many observations were raised by the Vice-Chancellor and his associates, the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the company, Mrs. Yemi Kerry assured the Vice-Chancellor that there would be absolute security of data and the University would be the only entity with access to control of the system.

Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni has recognized the importance of digitization. It is the reason why he is trying to key into it at the early stage of the University's development.

FUTD MANAGEMENT MEETS SENATE COMMITTEE ON LAND TRANSPORT, HIGHLIGHTS ACHIEVEMENTS AND CHALLENGES

he Interim Management Committee of Federal University of Transportation Daura (FUTD) has met with the Senate Committee on Land Transport where issues bordering on achievements and challenges of the University were presented before the Committee.

The meeting was held on Wednesday, 1st November, 2023 at the Meeting Room 231, Senate Building of the National Assembly Complex, Abuja.

Briefing the Committee, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Umar Adam Katsayal, mni highlighted some of the achievements recorded by the University since his appointment as the pioneer Vice-Chancellor of the institution.

"My assumption to duty has brought about the creation of Private Mail Box (PMB, 1050, Daura, Katsina State), Website (www.futd.edu.ng) and email addresses for Principal Officers and some staff, which included, for g e n e r a l i n f o r m a t i o n (info@futd.edu.ng), among others.

"We've also secured a Liaison Office for the University in Abuja at No.14, Lake Chad Crescent, Maitama District, and developed Academic Brief and Campus Master Plan, Soil Analysis and Environmental Impact Assessment, which are already submitted to the NUC as conditions for granting license to commence academic activities.

"The University has also undergone Resource Verification Exercise which had brought about the approval of the NUC for the

University to commence 14 academic programmes starting from 2023/2024 academic session.

"We're currently engaging with Federal Ministry of Finance for the provision of special financial intervention and Budget Office of the Federation for budgetary provision for 2024 Fiscal Year.

"Our engagement is also extended to the National Assembly where we are pursuing an enhanced budgetary allocation for 2024 and Office of the Head of Service of the Federation to secure a waiver for recruitment of staff.

"We've opened about five accounts after securing an Organizational Code through the Office of the Accountant General of the Federation as well as working towards the inclusion of the University into the IPPIS platform", the Vice-Chancellor stated.

He further said that the University

had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Sustainable Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards Enhancement Centre for Excellence (SPESSCE), A.B.U., Zaria with the aim of developing a robust training, and build capacity, especially in the area of transportation system among others.

According to the Vice-Chancellor, courtesy visits were paid to NITT, NCAT, NCC, NIMASA, NSC, NITDA, Galaxy Backbone Limited (GBB), NASENI among others, all with the aim of establishing partnerships and collaborations.

While highlighting some of the challenges facing the young University, the Vice-Chancellor stated that the University was yet to receive the usual Take-off Grant from the TETFund.

He added that the University was pursuing a waiver for employment

from the Office of the Head of Service of the Federation which made it difficult to carry out some activities effectively.

While pleading with the Committee to assist the University in the amplification of the proposed 1 billion naira budget for the University in the 2024 Fiscal Year, he stated that the University was not included in the budgetary allocation for the year 2023.

He then urged the Committee to assist the University to overcome the challenges identified. Responding to the Vice-Chancellor, the Chairman of the Committee, Senator Adamu Muhammad Aliero expressed optimism that the 1billion naira proposed for the University in the 2024 Fiscal Year would be amplified to 5billion naira as requested by the Vice-Chancellor.

He advised the Vice-Chancellor to seek for partnership with the Organized Private Sector (OPS), citing the example of Tata Nigeria Limited that established Automobile Workshop for specific training and Shell Petroleum Development Company training school for the Oil and Gas Sector.

He further highlighted the need for the University to collaborate with other institutions that offer similar Courses that would enable the new University to share resources for rapid growth and development.

He finally noted that it was important not to rely solely on the SCR pledge made by the CCECC, and promised to contact the Honourable Minister of Transportation in order to establish a concrete funding programme for the institution.
